Student Code of Conduct

Safe Harbor

- If a student discovers illegal objects such as drugs, weapons, or other contraband on school property, including on a school bus, the student may approach a school official and report the item(s).
- A student may not be in violation of the COC by making a report, if the school has *not* started an investigation. School officials shall adhere to policies and procedures concerning further investigation of the report.

Bullying

- If you **SEE** something **SAY** something.
- Be kind to one another! (words/social media posts do hurt)
- Request a restorative circle meeting.
- Report any issues you have with other students to your grade level dean.
- Teasing others is NOT okay and will lead to a consequence

Serious Misconduct of a Sexual Nature

- Saying sexually inappropriate things to someone.
- Sexually harassing or touching someone:
 - EXAMPLES: kissing, hugging, touching the wrong body parts, etc....
- Posting sexually inappropriate comments, pictures or videos on social media, ESPECIALLY w/o their permission.
- Sharing or continuing to share inappropriate comments, pictures, or videos on social media.


Sending inappropriate messages/pictures


- Any student caught sending inappropriate messages, comments, pictures, or videos through email or any social media will be investigated and consequences applied according to the COC. **ESPECIALLY FIGHTS!**
- Remember: Anything you post or send stays on the internet. Stays on the internet FOREVER!

Buying & Selling Items on Campus

Unless you are involved in a school-sponsored fundraiser, BUYING or SELLING ANY type of item is NOT allowed at Orange County Public Schools & Lake Nona Middle School.







Threats or False Statements (Level 4 Offense)

- Threats will NOT be taken LIGHTLY!
- Any threat made verbally or through social media will be investigated and consequences applied according to the COC.
- Threats made to students, staff or to the school will result in a Level 4 infraction and referred to law enforcement.

Weapons/Drugs/Alcohol/Vape Pens (Level 4 Offenses)

Any student caught using or in possession of a weapon, marijuana, pills, or alcohol will be investigated and consequences applied according to the COC. Expulsion from school may happen

Cell Phone/Headphones

- Technology policy in schools is STATE LAW!
- Students may use cell phones/smartwatches <u>before</u> and <u>after</u> school ONLY! (Before 9:20 and After 4:05)
- At 9:20 am, ALL technology must be <u>SILENCED</u> and <u>CONCEALED</u>. This means, kept in bookbag during the entire school day. (9:20-4:05)
- If you are caught with your technology (cell phone/earbud etc..) out or in your hand (or pocket), or using a smart watch it will be confiscated and tracked in Hero.
- Parents will be contacted. You will need to pick up your technology at the end of the day in the front office. More severe consequences will take place if misconduct is repeated
- If you get defensive and disrespectful about it, it then escalates to a discipline issue instead.

*this includes using smartwatches to get on the internet

Electronic Devices

- Ear-buds, headphones, Smart Watches must be stored in a bookbag throughout the school day.
- Speakers used with electronic devices are not allowed at school or on the bus.

While on Campus, Cell Phones and Headphones/Ear Buds...

- Must be SILENCED & CONCEALED*at ALL times.
- Concealed = Must NOT be visible at ALL during school day. Stored in backpack or purse.
- School day = Arrival to School until Dismissal.

*CANNOT BE OBSCURED or CONCEALED BY HAIR.

Classroom Expectations

- BE PREPARED! (Laptops charged, pen/pencil and paper available)
- Laptops are to be used for school purposes **ONLY**.
- Follow <u>ALL</u> Classroom Rules.
- NO EATING FOOD, CANDY, GUM, etc.. IN THE CLASSROOM*.
- Water is the only liquid you may drink outside the cafeteria. If you have any issues in class, speak with the teacher privately.
- Build a relationship with all your teachers, it will help you in the long run.

^{*}If you have a teacher who gives you candy in class, you must NOT walk out that room eating that candy. You will asked to throw it away.

Tardy to Class/School

- Be on time, NO EXCUSES!
- 4-minutes between each class
- Tardies to school and class will result in increasing disciplinary action.
- Random unannounced tardy sweeps.

Hallway Expectations

- NO EATING FOOD, CANDY, GUM, etc.. in the HALLWAY.
- When using the stairwell, please stay to the right!*
- Keep your hands and feet to yourself.
- DO NOT throw objects in the halls or down the stairs!
- Please follow all directions, your **SAFETY** depends on it.

*The stairwell by grade level offices will be used ONLY for those students going to the 1, 2, or 3rd floor during TRANSITIONS. Cannot exit through those doors to go to PE or the Portables. During TRANSITIONS only.

Drills Expectations

- Remain completely silent during drills
- Follow all teacher instructions
- Take drills seriously
- Consequences will be delivered through Hero for misbehaving during drills. There are no warnings, you will be called into the dean's office and your parents will be called. Consequences will follow.

Bathroom Expectations

- Bathrooms should be used for emergency reasons only.
- Bathroom breaks will be limited and determined by teacher.
- Make sure to wash or sanitize your hands before and after using the restroom.
- Anyone caught vandalizing the bathroom will receive a consequence. (Vandalism like writing/smearing things on the walls, breaking property, etc...)
- Abuse of bathroom privileges will result in consequences and parent being notified.
- Hallways are continuously monitored by cameras.

Bus Expectation


- Follow <u>ALL</u> bus rules. It is considered an extension of the school.

- Be respectful to the driver/monitor.
- Remember: The cameras on the bus work.

- Reward positive behaviors (MANY) students cash in points
- Deans will track the following negative behaviors:
 - Tardies
 - Technology Policy Violations
 - Dress Code

Dress Code Overview

- NO open-back shoes OR house slippers.
- NO headgear/hats/hoodies/bandanas allowed.
- <u>ALL shorts/skirts/dresses MUST reach mid-thigh (fingertip rule). Including biking shorts.</u>
- Clothing MUST fully cover the body from armpit to armpit and to at least the mid-thigh.
- Absolutely NO camis are to be worn or ANY undergarments showing.
- NO crop tops showing midriffs (no bellies or backs showing) allowed.
- NO low cut tops allowed. NO PAJAMAS ARE TO BE WORN TO SCHOOL!
- NO male/undergarment tanks are to be worn alone w/o appropriate covering.
- NO tank sports jerseys w/o t-shirts underneath allowed.
- NO holes in jeans above mid-thigh w/o leg coverings underneath.
- NO sagging pants allowed.

Dress Code Policy

- Clothes shall be worn as they are designed.
- Headgear: shall NOT be worn on campus unless it's approved by principal.
- Tops/Shirts/Blouses: <u>MUST</u> have broad straps, <u>NOT</u> be revealing, or expose undergarments.
- Bottom/Pants: Rips, holes, or tears in clothing must be at or below mid-thigh. NO pajama tops or bottoms EVER!
- Undergarments/underwear must not be visible.

Dress Code Cont.

Visit school website for further details on the OCPS Student Code of Conduct p26)

- See-through, revealing, or mesh garments must not be worn without appropriate coverage underneath that meet the minimum requirements of this dress code.
- Clothing must not state, imply, or depict hate speech or imagery targeting groups based on race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, religious affiliation, or any other protected class.
- Gang paraphernalia, garments and/or jewelry, tattoos, or other insignias, which display or suggest sexual, vulgar, drug, alcohol, or tobacco-related wording/graphics or may tend to provoke violence or disruption in school shall not be worn.
- Clothing and accessories that endanger students or staff shall not be worn.
- Be mindful of inappropriate Croc charms.

Skirts/Dresses/Shorts Length MUST be mid-thigh or longer

Dress Code Tip: Clothing must reach at or below mid-thigh/middle finger rule.

Short Shirts/Knotted Shirts/Sweaters

Shirts/Blouses/Tops NOT Allowed

REVEALING Tops:

- Strapless
- See through/mesh/lace tops
- Crop Tops
- Tube Tops
- Razor-back/T-back Tanks
- Camisoles/spaghetti straps
- Men's undershirt as a top
- Any top that SHOWS body parts you should not be showing. Especially when bending over.



Jeans with holes, torn/frayed

(holes must be at or below mid-thigh)









Pajama pants and house slippers are NOT permitted!

SAFE and Appropriate Footwear Must be Worn as Designed




- 1. High heels or Stilettos


*Crocs permissible in Sports Mode ONLY (strap behind the heel at all times)






OCPS Student Dress Code Expectations
