Tardy to Class/School

- •Be on time, NO EXCUSES!
- 4-minutes between each class
- Make sure you are 6ft away from each other at all times.

Social Distancing

- •Make sure you are 3 to 6 ft apart while in the courtyard and the hallways!
- Hands must be constantly washed or sanitized.
- Do not share any objects, (pens, water, books, masks)
- •No physical contact! (Hugs, high 5, grabbing of arms)

Masks

Should be worn at all

times!







Hallway Expectation

- Students must stay 6ft away from each other at all times.
- When using the stairwell, please stay to the right!
- Keep your hands and feet to yourself.
- DO NOT throw objects in the halls or down the stairs!
- Please follow all directions, your health may depend on it.

Classroom Expectation

- BE PREPARED! (Laptops charged, pen/pencil and paper available)
- Follow ALL Classroom Rules.
- NO EATING FOOD OR CANDY (GUM, Chips) IN THE CLASSROOM
- Water is the only liquid you may drink (Clear Bottle).
- If you have any issues in class, speak with the teacher privately. Make sure to follow all social distancing and safety guidelines. (Hand cleanliness and Masks)
- Build a relationship with all your teachers, it will help you in the long run!

Bathroom Expectation

- Bathrooms should be used for personal reasons only.
- Bathroom breaks will be limited, so only use in case of emergencies.
- Make sure to wash or sanitize your hands before and after using the restroom.
- Anyone caught vandalizing the bathroom will receive a consequence (Throwing food, milk, writing on the walls or smearing things on the walls).

Bus Expectation

- Follow ALL bus rules. It is considered an extension of the school!
- ·Walk to and from the bus.
- •Be respectful to the driver/monitor.
- Remember: The cameras on the bus work!

Dress Code Policy

- Clothes shall be worn as they are designed.
- Clothing must cover the body from one armpit across to the other armpit and down to approximately mid-thigh (see image to the right).
- Tops must have straps.
- Undergarments must not be viewable.
- Rips, holes, or tears in clothing must be below the knee.

Dress Code Cont.

- See-through, revealing, or mesh garments must not be worn without appropriate coverage underneath that meet the minimum requirements of this dress code.
- Clothing must not state, imply, or depict hate speech or imagery targeting groups based on race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, religious affiliation, or any other protected class.
- Gang paraphernalia, garments and/or jewelry, tattoos, or other insignias, which display or suggest sexual, vulgar, drug, alcohol, or tobacco-related wording/graphics or may tend to provoke violence or disruption in school shall not be worn.
- Clothing and accessories that endanger students or staff shall not be worn.

Dress Code Policy

If you come to school like this, you will be sent to the Grade Level Office.











Leggings

Over-garments (shirt, shorts, skirts/dresses) must cover front, back and sides and be at mid-thigh.









Skirts/Dresses/Shorts

Length MUST be mid-thigh or longer











Short shirts or Knotted shirts and sweaters









Shirts/Blouses/Tops

- •Tops must have straps.
- •Clothing must cover the body from one armpit across to the other armpit and down to approximately mid-thigh.

Jeans with holes, torn/frayed (holes must be below the knee)









Pajama pants and house slippers are NOT permitted!







Dangerous Clothing and Accessories

• Clothing and accessories that endanger students or staff shall not be worn.







Hats, caps, visors, sunglasses, bandanas, or headbands are not to be worn on campus during the school day.



Footwear

Safe and appropriate footwear must be worn.





- 1. High heels, no back
- 2. Bedroom slippers
 - 3. Slides
 - 4. Backless shoes







Cell Phone Policy

- •Students may use cell phones <u>before</u> and <u>after</u> school only.
- •Cell phones must be <u>turned off</u> and stored in a <u>non-visible</u> location during the entire school day.

School Policy for Beverages

- Outside beverages are **NOT** permitted in the academic halls nor in the classrooms during the school day.
- •ONLY WATER!
- Please do not share drinks with others!

Electronic Devices

• Ear buds and headphones must be stored in a non-visible location throughout the school day.

• Speakers used with electronic devices are not allowed at

school or on the bus









Code of Student Conduct

Safe Harbor

- If a student discovers illegal objects such as drugs, weapons, or other contraband on school property, including on a school bus, the student may approach a school official and report the item(s).
- A student may not be in violation of the COC by making a report, if the school has *not* started an investigation. School officials shall adhere to policies and procedures concerning further investigation of the report.

Bullying

- If you **SEE** something **SAY** something.
- Be kind to one another! (words/social media posts do hurt)
- Request a restorative circle meeting.
- Report any issues you have with other students to your grade level dean.

Threats or False Statements (Level 4 Offense)

- Threats will not be taken LIGHTLY!
- Any threat made verbally or through social media will be investigated and consequences applied according to the COC.
- Threats made to students, staff or to the school will result in a Level 4 infraction and referred to law enforcement.

Sending inappropriate messages/pictures

- Any student caught sending inappropriate messages or pictures through email or any social media will be investigated and consequences applied according to the COC.
- Remember: Anything you post or send stays on the internet!

Weapons/Drugs/Alcohol/Vape Pens (Level 4 Offenses)

•Any student caught using or in possession of a weapon, marijuana, pills, or alcohol will be investigated and consequences applied according to the COC.

Consequences

- Every negative action, has a consequence, so think before you to act!
- Consequences are given through a fair process.
- Virtual students who break the code of conduct are subject to disciplinary action.
